

# Visitation Procedures

Once you arrive to the facility you will receive your nasal swab rapid test (**YOU ARE NOW REQUIRED TO SHOW PROOF OF A NEGATIVE TEST WITHIN 24 HOURS OR A PCR WITHIN 48 HOURS**) regardless of vaccination status. Please remain in your car (**WE WILL RAPID TEST YOU**) and drive up to the first entrance by the day care center (in the roundabout under the overhang). A nurse will come out to your car and provide a COVID-19 nasal swab test. The nurse will only provide a test for those who are 18 years of age and older. No one under the age of 18 will be permitted at this time. Please park your car in a designated parking space and wait for your results to be read (usually 15 minutes). Upon entering the main entrance, you will then be checked for signs and symptoms of COVID-19.

As always, Bellhaven Center reserves the right to refuse visitation to anyone exhibiting any signs of illness, including COVID-19 symptoms, or who tests positive, or does not pass the screening questions. Screening will consist of temperature checks, exposure to COVID-19, etc.

- After the 15-minute time lapse, if you haven't heard from the lab, you may head to the main entrance for your visit.
- If your loved one is fully vaccinated (*2 WEEKS AFTER SECOND DOSE*), you can choose to have close contact (including touch) **BUT YOU MUST BE WEARING A WELL FITTED FACEMASK AND USE HAND SANATIZER BEFORE AND AFTER YOUR VISIT**. There are hand sanitizer stations throughout the facility for you to use.
- There is no limit as to the amount visitors can visit a loved one.
- Visiting hours are allowed on any day at any time regardless of vaccination status.
- If you or your loved one are not vaccinated then your visit must take place outside the resident's room in the lobby area. In addition, visitors may not visit inside a resident's room if their roommate is unvaccinated.
- Visitors must be 18 years of age or older, no pets allowed at this time.
- *Visitors must maintain social distancing (6ft) during their visit* unless you and your loved one are both fully vaccinated. There will be no food or drinks allowed while visiting your loved one. There cannot be any physical contact with other residents, families, or staff.
- Failure to comply with any of these guidelines will result in immediate termination of the visit and you will be asked to leave the facility.
- These guidelines are drafted using guidance from CMS, DOH, and other regulatory agencies, and are subject to change.
